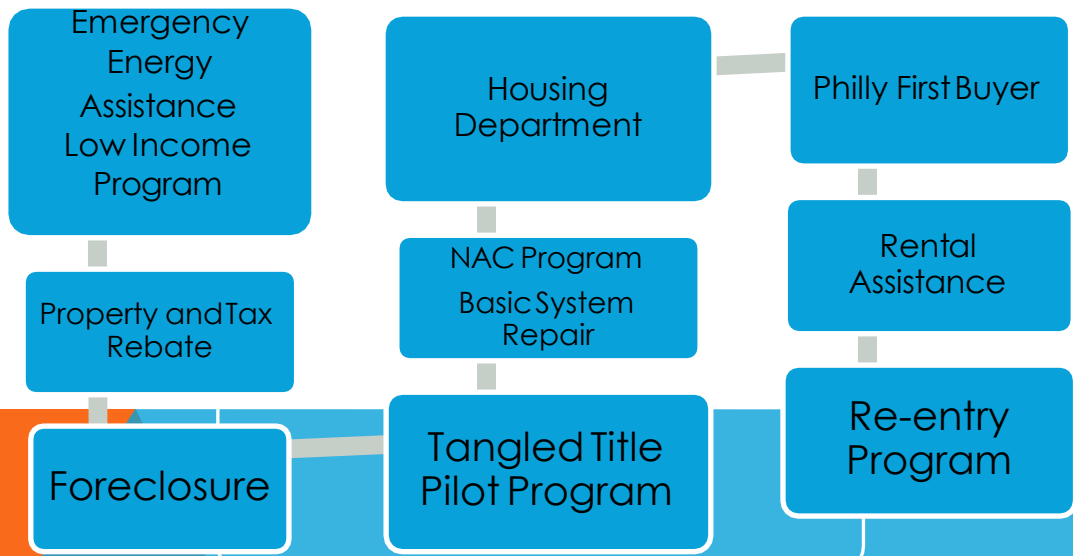

Agencies

- **Housing counseling agencies** offer services for groups and individuals. They help residents buy and maintain their homes, avoid eviction and foreclosure, and more.
- **Neighborhood Advisory Committees (NACs)** help residents find out about City programs that could benefit them.
- **Neighborhood Energy Centers (NECs)** provide information on how to save on utilities and get help paying energy bills.

Utility Assistance Programs and Resources

GPASS Can Get help with home heating bills, shut offs notices and home repairs.

What is LIHEAP? The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) helps families living on low incomes to pay heating bills with a grant that does not have to be paidback.

LIHEAP 2023-2024 Season open on November 1st 2023. We had help over 600 clients to applied since opening. With LIHEAP-CRISIS now closed GPASS can provide **Emergency Energy Assistance Funds for Service Reconnection. (CONTACT US TODAY)**

We also help you apply for these low income programs:

CAP: With the new CAP-PIPP, customers simply pay a percentage of their total household income as their monthly PECObill.

- **CRP:** CRP is a customer assistance program that can help low-income customers better afford their PGW bills and keep their gas service on.

- **PWD TAP & Senior Discounts:** If your income is too high for those programs, a Special Hardship can make you eligible for TAP. Customers in TAP can work toward Debt Forgiveness.

- Diagnostic assessment of air leakage
- Health and safety repairs
- Electric base load measures
- Client energy education

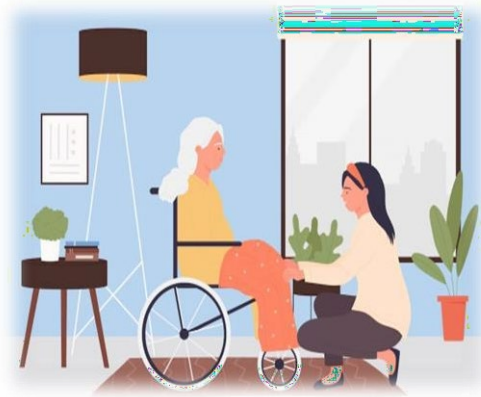
If you need Free Home repairs and or free home adaptations GPASS can help you apply for:

- **Adaptive Modifications Programs:** designed to help low-income individuals with permanent physical disabilities live more independently in their homes. It provides free adaptations to a house or an apartment, allowing easier access to and mobility within the home.
- **Basic Systems Repair Program (BSRP):** provides free repairs to correct electrical, plumbing, heating, limited structural and carpentry, and roofing emergencies in eligible owner-occupied homes in Philadelphia.

GPASS SAFE - Dr. Tracey Jones in our team as the new Medical Director of the SAFE Co-Occurring Program. With her extensive knowledge and experience in the field, we are excited to have her lead our program. Dr. Jones' appointment as Medical Director is a testament to her exceptional qualifications and expertise.

GPASS SAFE - Mr. Symphorian Kamanou, a certified psychiatric nurse practitioner, to fulfill the role of conducting psych evaluations, administering medication, and providing Medicated Assistant Treatment. Mr. Kamanou's extensive experience and credentials make him an ideal candidate for this position. He will be responsible for ensuring the health and safety of our clients by using his clinical expertise to evaluate, diagnose, and initiate appropriate treatment plans.

GPASS HOUSING COUNSELING PROGRAM

GPASS DHC is one of the many successful housing counseling programs in the City. We work to promote housing stability in the lives of the residents surrounding our local area and in the outlying Pennsylvania area by assisting residents in retaining their housing, improving their existing housing, and acquiring better housing.

For the past few months, GPASS Housing counseling Department has been providing educational workshops and one-on-one counseling sessions to many first time home buyers. The First Time Home Buyers workshops have transitioned back to a biweekly basis instead of weekly due to the increasing demand for new homebuyers eager to attend the workshop but with the increase, come an opportunity to expand and welcome more counselors.

The Philly First Time Home Buyers Grant provides assistance (6% of the sales prices of the home) or up to \$10,000 which can be used towards down payments or closing costs. Since the last newsletter, counselors have successfully approved more than 60 people for the grant.

GPASS open the one time Rental Assistance program for rental and or security deposit, helping clients stay in their homes. If anyone is interested in receiving any housing resources we are here at GPASS to assist you. Tangled Title Pilot Program



A tangled title is a property title that does not accurately reflect the present homeowner's claim to the home. For instance, many children or grandchildren currently live in homes that are still in the name of a deceased parent or grandparent. When someone passes away, other relatives often continue to live in the home without changing the name on the deed. An incorrect deed will often not affect day-to-day life, but a tangled title can make solving problems with your house, especially urgent ones, difficult or impossible. Addressing tangled titles before there is an emergency like a foreclosure, utility shutoff, or structural damage is an important part of protecting homes for generations to come. GPASS is able to refer to PLA to provide advice to or represent clients, who are working through the probate process and preparing and filing a deed with the Philadelphia Department of Records.

Tangled Title Program

Resolving Tangled Titles in Philadelphia

If you live in a house that you cannot prove ownership for because your name does not appear on the deed, you may have a tangled title.

This often happens if:

- A relative owned the house you live in but has passed away
- You live alone in your house, but the original owner has moved or passed away
- You lease or rent-to-own your house and have paid all or some of the purchase price, but your name is not on the deed

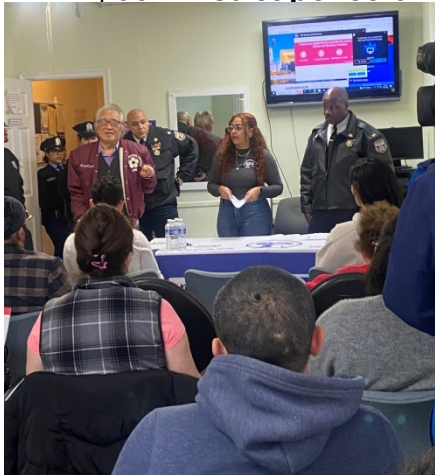
